# Visitor Center Project to Continue Thacher Park Renaissance

During the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century, Thacher and the Hilltowns were the nexus of Capital Region tourism and a summer resort, with the advent of hotels like the Lakeside, Lakeview and Thompsons Lake and other attractions. Later in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the Thacher Park pool continued the tradition of Capital Region residents escaping the city heat to the cool embrace of the Helderbergs.

In the wake of Thacher Park's centennial celebration in fall 2014, an exciting new chapter will be written just feet from the escarpment. Early this summer, ground will be broken for a state-of-theart, sustainable Visitor Center for Friends and more than 300,000 annual park visitors to gather to learn more about Thacher's unique history, geological features and year-round recreational opportunities.

The Center will be a focal point for the Park, and is designed to showcase its unique natural setting, situated on a trailhead for the Park's iconic Indian Ladder Trail. It will feature event space and custom exhibits focused on Park history like the Tory Cave, Helderberg Anti-Rent Wars, Native American presence on the escarpment, and establishment of the Park in 1914 by Emma Treadwell Thacher, in honor of her late husband and former Albany mayor, John Boyd Thacher. New and established visitors alike will be fascinated to learn of Thacher's pre-eminent role in American geology, and the diverse fossils that can still be viewed in the Park. Offices for Park staff will also be in the Center, and allow for staff to be on hand to greet and educate visitors.

Imagine leaving the cold winter winds after a snowy hike or ski to bask in the warmth of a wood fire in the Center's hearth. Lectures and park activities will find a natural home in one of the Center's indoor or outdoor meeting spaces. You'll be able to bring your binoculars to spot hawks and other raptors from the veranda, or just enjoy Thacher's stunning views of four states. Indoor and outdoor space at the Center will be maximized to facilitate enjoyment of the escarpment and support established and new activities: hiking, snowshoeing, skiing, mountain biking (coming soon!) rock climbing and caving.

There will be opportunities for Friends, Hilltowns residents and other Park supporters to participate in the Visitor Center's inception. Stay tuned to hear how you can participate in writing a new page in Thacher's history, including a date for the groundbreaking event this summer.

### I Love My Park Day 2015 Park Office Spruce Up



Rhododendrons are thriving around the Park Office, framing the entrance, along with several yews and photogenic Sugar Maples that blaze in the Fall. All of this provides a spot, sought out for a photo in Spring or Fall. You'll see that the yews in front are in need of some trimming and the groundcover needs some attention. A garden "facelift" for the office building, that has been serving the Park since the 1950s, has become the Garden Gang 2015 "I Love My Park" project.

After a quick check with John Lowe, Interim Park Manager, for his O.K., we got under way. We chose "I Love My Park Day" 2015 because we wanted to involve area volunteers. People who have a vested interest in and actually visit the Park will participate in a day of "giving back" and making a difference.

Our plan will be to trim back the yews, clean any winter debris and weed out anything that doesn't belong

in a Native Plant flower bed. As we did last year, we enlisted the help of Laurel Tormey Cole of the Nature Center and Joy Scism of the Park for advice on what Native Plants would do well in this setting. Already established Native Plants will be augmented with favorite perennials – Black Eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*), Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*) and Maple Leaf Alum Root (*Heuchera villosa*). Quick color will be added by Petunias and Alyssum from the Park's Flower Power program.

The Park's other planters will receive their Spring cleaning too. After raking out leaves, some of the above perennials, Petunias and Alyssum will be added to the daylilies and other emerging perennials.

Since the newsletter will be going out just about the same time as May 2<sup>nd</sup> is underway, I hope you join us Saturday to work or stop by to see the planters and all of the other projects so many people will be helping with to prepare Thacher for the Summer.
